# **NOAH'S FLOOD WAS UNIVERSAL!**

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• Many professed Christians while they believe that a flood in the time of Noah did indeed occur, they do not believe that it was a universal, world-wide catastrophe. Rather, they believe that it was merely a local Mesopotamian flood that took place in the time of Noah. They try to interpret the plain statements in the book of <u>Genesis</u> to harmonize with their theory. They take this position to try and harmonize the statements of the Bible concerning this event, with their acceptance of the theories of atheistic, evolutionary geologists, concerning the age of the earth and their uniformitarian theories¹ about past events that have occurred in the natural world.

It may be helpful at this point to give a simple chronology of the events listed in the book of Genesis that took place during the flood.

## THE BIBLICAL EVIDENCE THAT SUPPORTS A UNIVERSAL FLOOD: -

#### • THE DEPTH OF THE FLOODWATERS: -

It rained for forty days and forty nights upon the earth. It would be at the end of the 40<sup>th</sup> day and night of rain, that the floodwaters would have reached their maximum height, which is recorded as being 15 cubits above **all** the high hills or mountains under the whole of heaven. This necessitates that the flood had to be universal in its scope to cover every high mountain upon the earth.

#### FOR ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY DAYS THE FLOODWATERS PREVAILED AT THIS HEIGHT UPON THE EARTH: -

It was only **after** the time period of 150 days or five complete months had elapsed, that the prevailing floodwaters upon the earth started to abate. For the height of the floodwaters to be prevailing 15 cubits above every high mountain upon all the earth for 150 days, shows us that the flood had to be a tremendous, universal catastrophe.

#### FOR TWO HUNDRED AND TWENTY ONE DAYS THE FLOOD WATERS WERE ABATING FROM OFF THE EARTH: -

From the time that the floodwaters started to abate from off the earth (that is on the 150<sup>th</sup> day) to the time when Noah was able to leave the ark, there was another 221 days of the floodwaters abating. This time period for the abating floodwaters to drain off from the earth could only apply to a universal catastrophe, and **NOT** to some localized flood.

#### THE NEED FOR AN ARK: -

If the flood had been limited in geographical extent, there would have been no need for Noah to construct an ark at all, for there would have been ample time for Noah's family to escape the danger area, and also for the beasts and the birds to leave the proposed flood area as well.

#### GOD HIMSELF TESTIFIED THAT THE FLOOD WAS GOING TO BE UNIVERSAL IN ITS SCOPE OF DESTRUCTION: -

God stated repeatedly that he was going to bring a flood upon the earth that would destroy every living thing, both mankind and all the animals that were upon the earth, because of the wickedness of all flesh.

Genesis 6:7: - "And the LORD said, I will destroy man whom I have created from the face of the earth; both man, and beast, and the creeping thing, and the fowls of the air; for it repenteth me that I have made them."

Genesis 6:12 & 13: - "And God looked upon the earth, and, behold, it was corrupt; for all flesh had corrupted his way upon the earth. And God said unto Noah, The end of all flesh is come before me; for the earth is filled with violence through them; and, behold, I will destroy them with the earth."

Genesis 6:17: - "And, behold, I, even I, do bring a flood of waters upon the earth, to destroy all flesh, wherein [is] the breath of life, from under heaven; [and] every thing that [is] in the earth shall die."

<u>Genesis 7:4:</u> - "For yet seven days, and I will cause it to rain upon the earth forty days and forty nights; and every living substance that I have made will I destroy from off the face of the earth."

#### GOD FULFILLS HIS WORD: -

A clear principle of God's character as recorded in the Scriptures is the fact, that when he has stated that he would do something, he will do it. He is faithful to fulfill his word.

Numbers 23:19: - "God [is] not a man, that he should lie; neither the son of man, that he should repent: hath he said, and shall he not do [it]? or hath he spoken, and shall he not make it good?"

<u>Isaiah 46:9-11: -</u> "Remember the former things of old: **for I [am] God, and [there is] none else; [I am] God, and [there is] none like me,** declaring the end from the beginning, and from ancient times [the things] that are not [yet] done, saying, My counsel shall stand, and I will do all my pleasure: Calling a ravenous bird from the east, the man that executeth my counsel from a far country: yea, I have spoken [it], I will also bring it to pass; I have purposed [it], I will also do it."

<u>Ezekiel 24:14: -</u> "I the LORD have spoken [it]: it shall come to pass, and I will do [it]; I will not go back, neither will I spare, neither will I repent; according to thy ways, and according to thy doings, shall they judge thee, saith the Lord GOD."

God is recorded in the book of <u>Genesis</u> as stating <u>THREE TIMES</u> after the flood, that he would never again destroy every living thing, or all flesh, or destroy the earth with a flood as he had just done.

Genesis 8:21: - "And the LORD smelled a sweet savour; and the LORD said in his heart, I will not again curse the ground any more for man's sake; for the imagination of man's heart [is] evil from his youth; neither will I again smite any more every thing living, as I have done."

Genesis 9:11: - "And I will establish my covenant with you; neither shall all flesh be cut off any more by the waters of a flood; neither shall there any more be a flood to destroy the earth."

<u>Genesis 9:15:</u> "And I will remember my covenant, which [is] between me and you and every living creature of all flesh; and the waters shall no more become a flood to destroy all flesh."

God is recorded in the book of <u>Isaiah</u> as stating that the floodwaters did indeed envelope the earth in the time of Noah. <u>Isaiah 54:9:</u> "For this [is as] the waters of Noah unto me: **for [as] I have sworn that the waters of Noah should no more go over the earth;** so have I sworn that I would not be wroth with thee, nor rebuke thee."

• God said that he would send a flood to destroy all forms of life upon the earth, and he did indeed fulfill his word by doing just that. His faithfulness to fulfill his word is part of his very character. As far as the testimony of God himself is concerned, the flood was indeed **UNIVERSAL** in its scope of destruction, in that it destroyed all flesh and every living thing upon the earth; and it also destroyed the earth itself.

#### GOD CANNOT TELL LIES: -

We must remember that the Bible teaches us plainly, that <u>God cannot tell a lie.</u>

1 Samuel 15:29: - " And also **the Strength of Israel will not lie** nor repent: for he [is] not a man, that he should repent."

Titus 1:2: - "In hope of eternal life, which God, that cannot lie, promised before the world began."

<u>Hebrews 6:18:</u> "That by two immutable things, **in which [it was] impossible for God to lie**, we might have a strong consolation, who have fled for refuge to lay hold upon the hope set before us."

To believe that the flood was only a localized geographic event makes God out to be a liar! Do those professed Christians who hold to a local Mesopotamian flood theory realize that this is the only conclusion that we can draw concerning God, if their theory is correct? The truth is that God told Noah the truth that he would never again destroy every living thing, and all flesh that is upon the earth, or the earth itself with a flood, as he had just done.

### • THE TESTIMONY OF THE NEW TESTAMENT SCRIPTURES: -

Our Saviour the Lord Jesus Christ has positively testified that the flood in the time of Noah destroyed all the wicked inhabitants of the earth

<u>Luke 17:26 & 27:</u> "And as it was in the days of Noe, so shall it be also in the days of the Son of man. They did eat, they drank, they married wives, they were given in marriage, until the day that Noe entered into the ark, **and the flood came, and destroyed them all.**"

The apostle Peter has stated that only eight souls were saved from the destruction of the floodwaters.

<u>1 Peter 3:20:</u> - "Which sometime were disobedient, when once the longsuffering of God waited in the days of Noah, while the ark was a preparing, wherein few, that is, eight souls were saved by water."

Peter testified that God saved Noah and his other seven family members but brought the flood upon the world of the ungodly. 2 Peter 2:5: - "And spared not the old world, but saved Noah the eighth [person], a preacher of righteousness, bringing in the flood upon the world of the ungodly."

## THE LAST DAY PROPHECY OF THE APOSTLE PETER: -

The apostle Peter has made an astonishingly accurate prophecy concerning the rise of last day mockers and scoffers. It is as up to date as today's scientific textbooks. He predicted that these last day infidels would arise claiming that everything has continued in the same fashion in the natural world, as it has since the start of this world's history. This is clearly referring to the rise of the theory of <a href="UNIFORMITARIANISM">UNIFORMITARIANISM</a> that has arisen in the last 170 years or so. These skeptics are <a href="willingly ignorant">willingly ignorant</a> of the truth of God's creating this world, and of the floodwaters destroying the world that then existed. Peter's use of the flood as a basis for refuting the uniformitarian skeptics of the lasts days would be absolutely pointless if the flood had been merely a local one, especially when we consider the cosmic context into which he has placed the watery catastrophe, in relation to the coming of the final Day of Judgment for the destruction of the ungodly.

<u>2 Peter 3:3-7: - "Knowing this first, that there shall come in the last days scoffers, walking after their own lusts, and saying, Where is the promise of his coming? for since the fathers fell asleep, all things continue as [they were] from the beginning of the creation. For this they willingly are ignorant of, that by the word of God the heavens were of old, and the earth standing out of the water and in the water: Whereby the world that then was, being overflowed with water, perished: But the heavens and the earth, which are now, by the same word are kept in store, reserved unto fire against the day of judgment and perdition of ungodly men."</u>

• The testimony of God's word is clear and decided. The Bible plainly teaches that God did indeed send a worldwide flood at the time of Noah, to destroy all the wicked inhabitants of the world, and to save righteous Noah and his family, and the animals within the ark from destruction. To try to harmonize the Bible with the theories of godless evolutionary scientists is to fall under the condemnation of the above prophesy. It comes down to a simple choice of where we desire to place our faith. Either we can believe in the God who was there and who never tells a lie, or in the speculations of the evolutionary scientists who were not. The choice is that simple.
