CHRIST HAS SET THE STANDARD IN THE JUDGMENT!

Christ has set the standard in the judgment. The words given to Christ by his Father, and which were spoken by Christ's mouth, are the standard in the judgment.

John 12:48 - 50: - "He that rejecteth me, and receiveth not my words, hath one that judgeth him: the word that I have spoken, the same shall judge him in the last day. For I have not spoken of myself; but the Father which sent me, he gave me a commandment, what I should say, and what I should speak. And I know that his commandment is life everlasting: whatsoever I speak therefore, even as the Father said unto me, so I speak."

Many professed Christians deny the Law of **Ten** Commandments as being binding in their lives – that they are not obligated to keep these righteous precepts for eternal life. What did Jesus say about these Ten Great Laws? Matthew 19:16 - 19: - "And, behold, one came and said unto him, Good Master, what good thing shall I do, that I may have eternal life? And he said unto him, Why callest thou me good? [there is] none good but one, [that is], God: but if thou wilt enter into life, keep the commandments. He saith unto him, Which? Jesus said, Thou shalt do no murder, Thou shalt not commit adultery, Thou shalt not steal, Thou shalt not bear false witness, Honour thy father and [thy] mother: and, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself."

NOTE: - Christ quotes from the Law of Exodus 20:3 - 17. As Christ warned us, these words of his will be the standard of judgment in the last day for your soul! Can we dare deny the authority of Christ! If we have claimed eternal life through Christ without obedience to the Ten Commandments of God, that Christ himself has commanded us to keep, then we are indeed LOST!

James confirms the words of Christ above, in the following words.

James 1:25: - "But whose looketh into the perfect law of liberty, and continueth [therein], he being not a forgetful hearer. but a doer of the work, this man shall be blessed in his deed."

James 2:8 - 12 & 14: - "If ye fulfil the royal law according to the scripture, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself, ye do well: But if ye have respect to persons, ye commit sin, and are convinced of the law as transgressors. For whosoever shall keep the whole law, and yet offend in one [point], he is guilty of all. For he that said. Do not commit adultery, said also, Do not kill. Now if thou commit no adultery, yet if thou kill, thou art become a transgressor of the law. So speak ye, and so do, as they that shall be judged by the law of liberty. ... What [doth it] profit, my brethren, though a man say he hath faith, and have not works? can faith save him? " NOTE: - James guotes from the whole law of Exodus 20:3 - 17, which includes the observance of the seventh day-

Saturday Sabbath.

Can anyone escape the judgment of the last day? No not one!

Romans 14:10 - 12: - "But why dost thou judge thy brother? or why dost thou set at nought thy brother? for we shall all stand before the judgment seat of Christ. For it is written, [As] I live, saith the Lord, every knee shall bow to me, and every tongue shall confess to God. So then every one of us shall give account of himself to God."

Ecclesiastes 12:13 & 14: - "Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God, and keep his commandments: for this [is] the whole [duty] of man. For God shall bring every work into judgment, with every secret thing, whether [it be] good, or whether [it be] evil."
